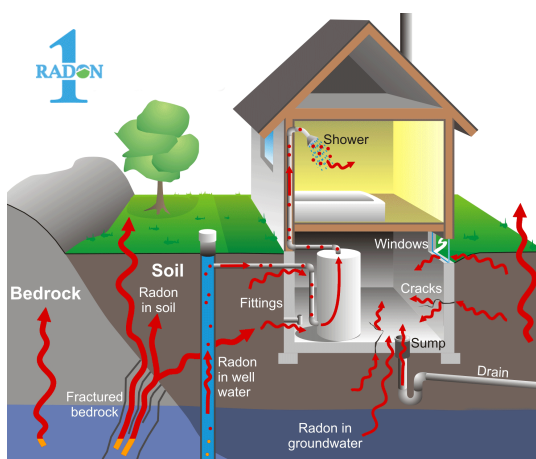

cancer cells. EPA advises taking action to reduce radon in houses that have a radon degree at or above 4 picocuries per litre (pCi/L) of air (a "picocurie" is a common unit for measuring the amount of radioactivity). The only means to know whether it remains in your home is to examine for it-- and also there is no secure degree for radon. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency established, nonetheless, that radon degrees over 4 picocuries per litre or greater in the house requirement focus.
