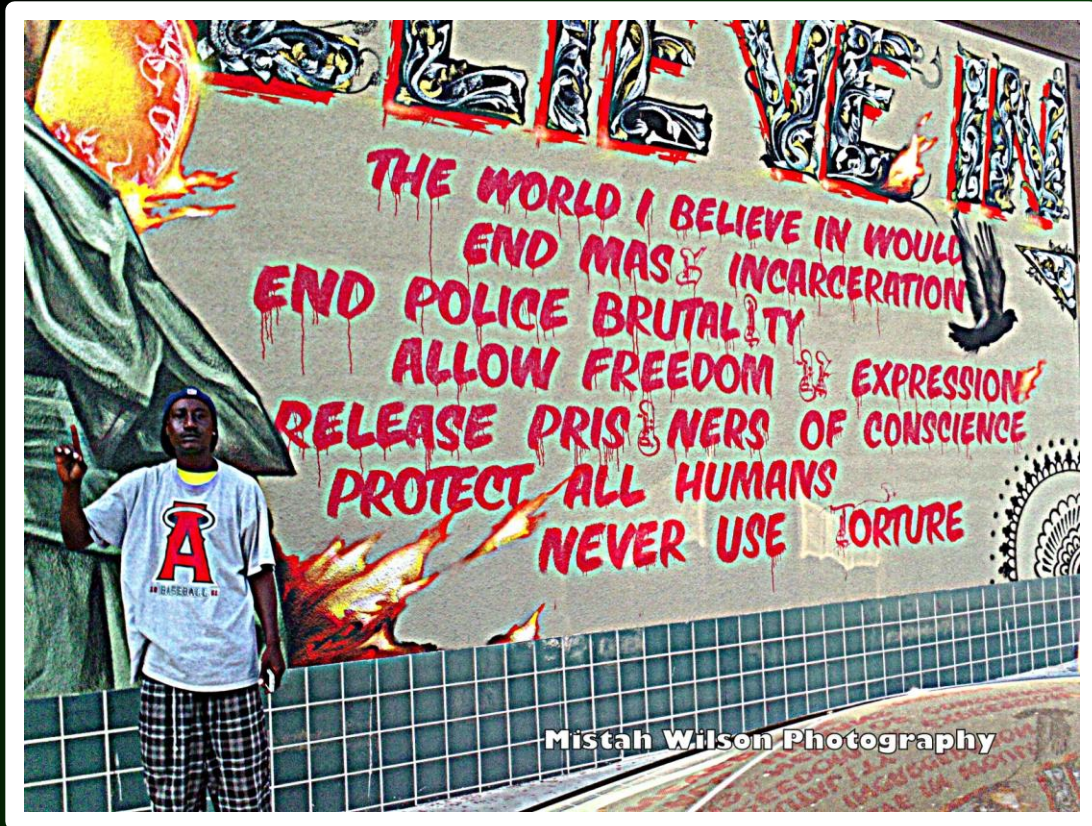

Claremont

City of Claremont

Claremont, founded by the Atchison, Topeka, and the Santa Fe Railroad in 1887 is now a residential community of 37,000 people nestled beneath the foothills of the San Gabriel Mountains. The city provides quality services, and has been recognized for its city planning efforts, its rich cultural heritage, and its college town charm.

A tree city U.S.A., Claremont boasts over 1,000 acres of parks, tree-lined streets, and is home to the six Claremont Colleges. This car is dedicated to Claremont, an innovative leader in transit, combining paratransit, bus service, commuter rail and preservation of the Santa Fe depot.

Culver City

City of Culver City

Culver City, "The Heart of Screenland" was incorporated in 1917. Settled by the Machado family in 1810 as part of a Spanish land grant along La Ballona Creek, the city was planned in 1913 by Harry Culver. Early growth occurred as the Pacific Electric Red Car lines extended to Culver City which was a major transfer point.

Motion picture studios contributed to the city's growth including Ince, MGM, RKO-Pathe, Hal Roach, Desilu and others. Today, Culver City is 4.9 square miles, with over 40,000 residents. This car is dedicated to Culver City, still the home of motion picture and television studios.

El Monte

City of El Monte

A Spanish word for forest or wooded spot, El Monte was named by early Spanish settlers during the 18th century for its willows, trees and meadows. El Monte developed a rich frontier heritage when settlers would stop at the end of the Santa Fe Trail in Camp Monte on their way from the East. They soon created a thriving community which now boasts almost 100,000 population, a historical museum featuring early American and pioneer memorabilia, a State Landmark Historical Park including the famous Old El Monte Jail, and Longo Toyota, the largest Toyota auto dealership in the world. This car is dedicated to El Monte.

Hawthorne

City of Hawthorne

Hawthorne was established in 1905 by C. L. Harding and H. D. Lombard, who named it after author Nathaniel Hawthorne. Incorporated in 1922, Hawthorne evolved from a prime agriculture-based development to become the heart of aviation/high technology industries, primarily because of its ideal location in the climate-perfect South Bay area. This car is named after Hawthorne, whose residents are proud to be in the "City of Good Neighbors" and who extend a welcome to the "Gateway" to the South Bay.

Hidden Hills

City of Hidden Hills

Nestled between the western foothills of the San Fernando Valley and the Ventura County line, Hidden Hills has preserved a country way of life that has nearly vanished from the surrounding communities of Southern California. The absence of sidewalks and street lights, the white three rail wooden fences, the corrals, the barns, the bridal trails, and the horseback riders tell visitors that this is a truly special place to live.

This car is named in honor of Hidden Hills, one example of small town Southern California living at its finest.

Lancaster

City of Lancaster

Lancaster is situated in the high desert of Northern Los Angeles County. The city is best known as the home of world famous Edwards Air Force Base, landing site of the Space Shuttle. Incorporated in 1977, Lancaster blossomed during the railroad days of the 1880's. In the 1980's, the city enjoyed unprecedented growth, turning this sleepy desert community into a sophisticated, modern city. The cultural and economic hub of the Antelope Valley, Lancaster is acclaimed as a perfect place to raise a family. This car is named in honor of the citizens of Lancaster.

City of Paramount

Paramount, incorporated in 1957, was originally known as the communities of Clearwater and Hynes. The city began as a hay and dairy community with the price of Hynes hay quoted daily around the nation.

Today, Paramount is a modern All-American City.

Paramount is the home of the largest ice skating rink west of the Mississippi River and home of the internationally known Zamboni ice cleaning machine.

This car is named in honor of the citizens of Paramount.

Known internationally for its annual Tournament of Roses Parade and Rose Bowl game, Pasadena is rich in ethnic diversity, cultural and educational opportunities. The Norton Simon Museum of Art and California Institute of Technology are among its many cultural amenities. Seated at the base of the San Gabriel Mountains, Pasadena's 132,000 residents are proud of its natural and urban beauty. Beginning in 1873, early Pasadena developers blended local geography with aesthetically pleasing architecture and a thoughtfully designed community, a tradition that continues today.

City of Rolling Hills Estates

Rolling Hills Estates was incorporated and dedicated to the preservation of its rural residential character. From the days of the Rancho San Pedro land grant through the pioneering efforts of early 20th century ranchers and farmers, Rolling Hills Estates has maintained its unique character by careful management of natural resources with an emphasis on preserving open space, scenic views and equestrian activities. This car is dedicated to the 29 distinct neighborhoods within the community that reflect their own architectural style and feeling while staying true to the goals of the city's founders.

Redondo Beach

CITY OF REDONDO BEACH

The City of Redondo Beach celebrated its 100th anniversary in 1992, but visitors have enjoyed the location for more than 6,000 years. Today's 60,000 residents live in an area discovered by Indians who took advantage of the sea's salt for trading and the temperate climate. Since the 1920s the Redondo Pier and adjacent marinas have been popular with visitors, including those who rode to the beach on Pacific Electric Red Cars. Currently cafes and boutiques at Riviera Village and 160 stores at the Galleria at South Bay offer a variety of shopping and dining experiences.

Nestled in the foothills of the San Gabriel Mountains and off the beaten path, Sierra Madre remains a small town known for its beauty. Founded in 1881, it attracted health seekers, artists and is a wonderful place to raise a family. The volunteer spirit prevails throughout the community with its all volunteer fire department, Search and Rescue Team, Annual Friends of the Library Art Fair and an annual Rose Parade entry that is entirely a volunteer community effort. It is famous for the world's largest Wisteria Vine and celebrates its blooming with an annual festival.

This car is dedicated to the citizens of Sierra Madre.

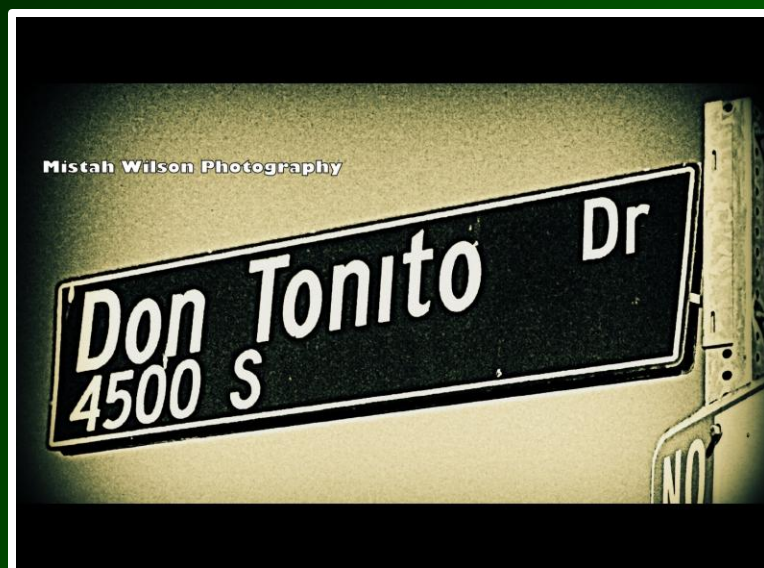
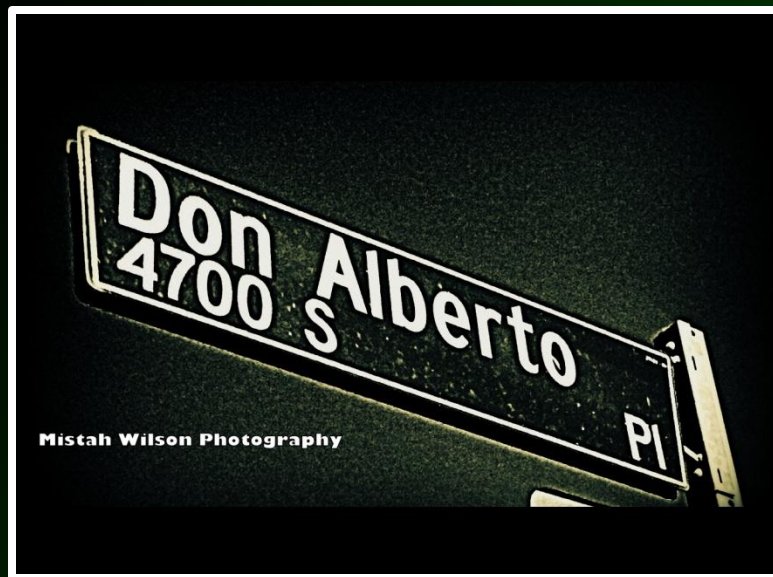

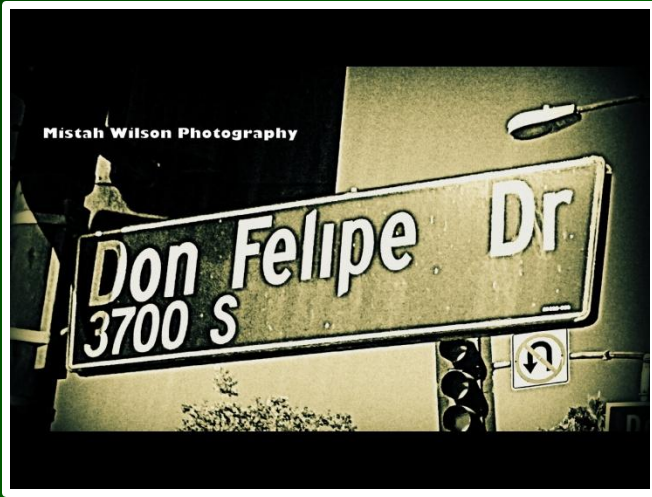
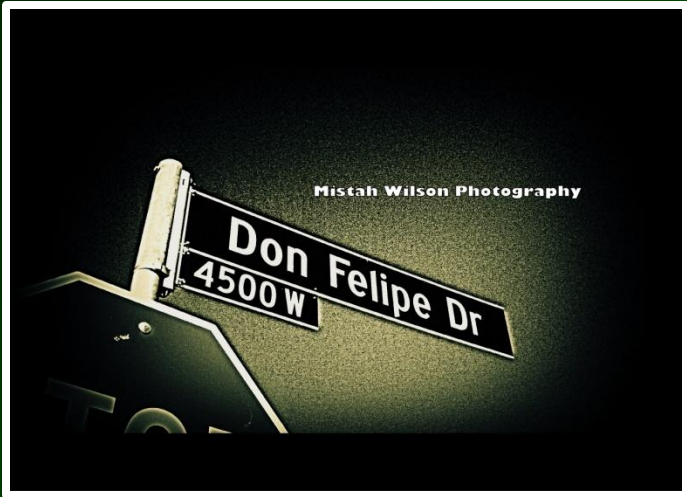
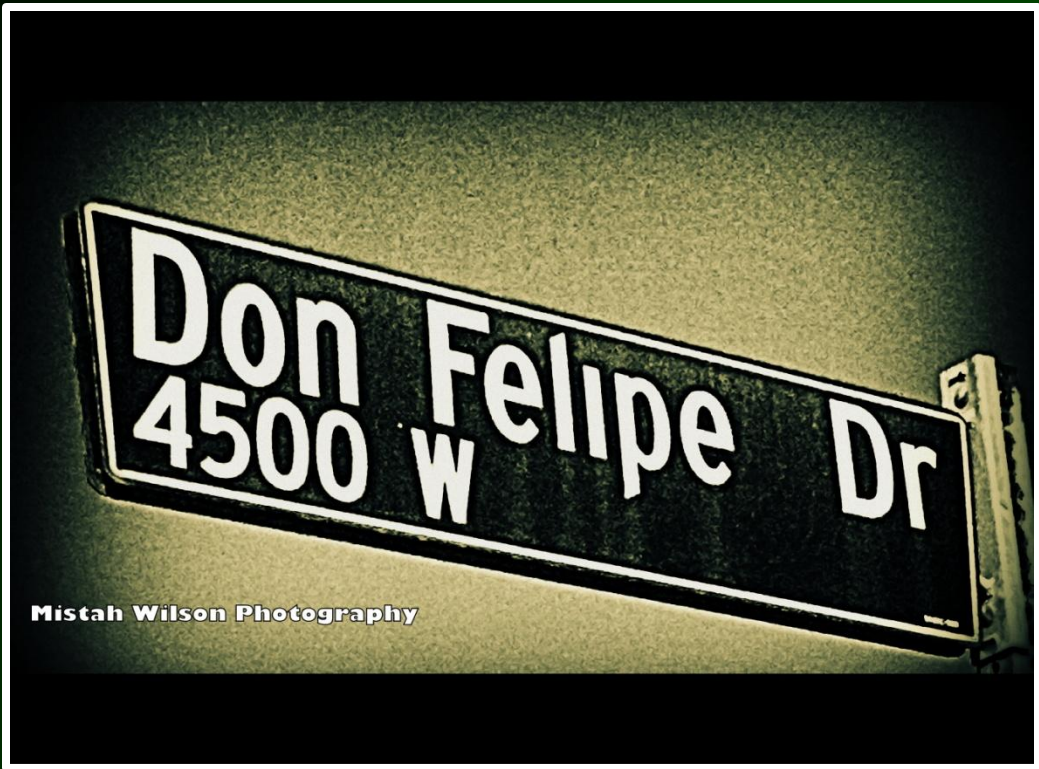
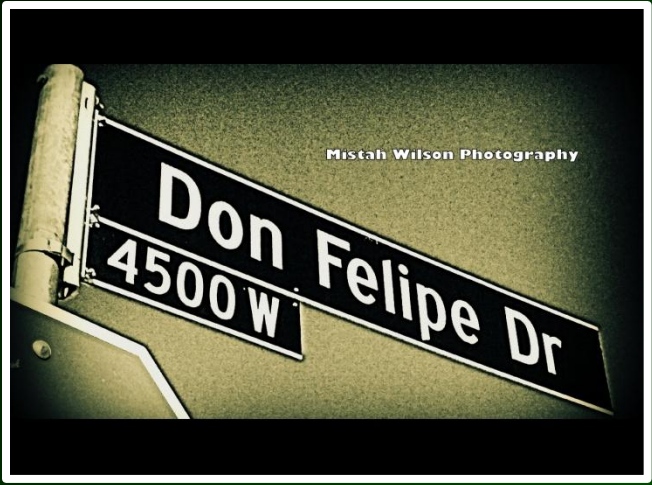
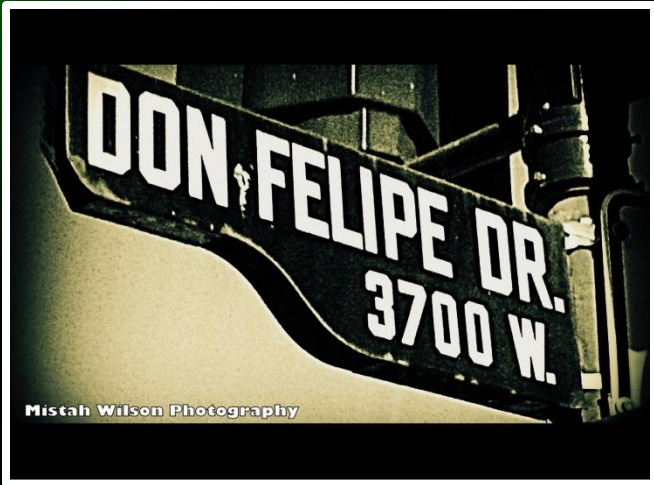
South Pasadena

City of South Pasadena

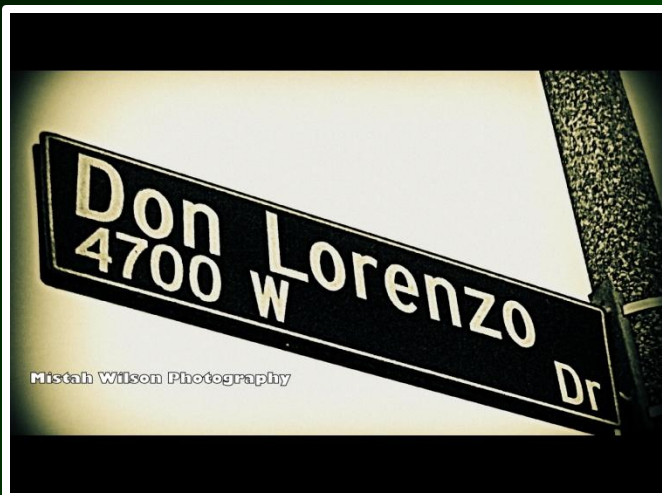

In the early days, South Pasadena was home to the world-famous Cawston Ostrich Farms. Ostrich feathers were in demand worldwide. Just as it was over a century ago, South Pasadena retains much of its residential charm with stately trees lining its residential streets.
